Campus Happenings

New shade structures have been installed! On October 12, the structures were installed on the ECC playground providing much needed relief from the heat. Temperature readings on various pieces of the playground equipment have measured up to 165°, rendering them off limits to children. With the installation of the shade structures, however, every inch of the playground will be assessable to all, providing shelter not only from heat but some damp weather as well. Four structures were erected; three covering the

large play structures and one covering the location of a future sand box (more about that in next month's report).

and Patricia Valero, but welcomed two wonderful individuals in their places. Hermilia Ibarra joined the staff as a PK aide on the 3rd and Leticia Graham as Director's Secretary on the 10th. Both transferred from other campuses within the district.

The Head Start Policy Council met on October 3 and approved several items including the By-laws and several policies and procedures. Training was given on Policy Council Areas of Authority.

Component Area News



Education / Disabilities / ERSE

- Continued to enroll students for all programs.
- Fifteen children on the Head Start waiting list are being served in PK 4 classrooms.
- Nine students withdrew this month: 4 moved out of district; 2 had excessive absences; and 3 moved to home school or full time daycare.
- Six students are active referrals for special education.
- Two teacher meetings were held to discuss Galileo, emergency go-bags, playground supervision, and upcoming events.
- Initial SAT meetings were held.
- LPAC meetings were conducted and placement recommendations were made for 14 students.

Family Involvement & Community Partnerships / Attendance / Transition / Volunteers

- The first Parent Meeting of the school year was held on October 6. Approximately 24% of ECC parents attended.
- Parents continue to attend GED and ESL classes with good overall attendance. One parent will be ready to test in late November.
- One parent was connected to needed resources through the SA Food Bank.
- Eight home visits were made related to attendance.
- Twenty-one ECC families are known to have had some level of CPS involvement within the past 12 months.
- One hundred, ninety volunteers have received training to date.

Health / Mental Health / Campus Safety / Nutrition

- Provided first aid to 78 students.
- Followed-up on required immunizations & HS physical & dental exams through phone calls, letters and teacher conferences.
- Results of the safety audit were reported with no significant problems cited.
- Scheduled and conducted 9 nutrition appointments with parents along with Mrs. Boles.
- Conducted vision & hearing screenings on new students.
- Met with Bree Hendrix-Peart, mental health consultant, regarding several students.
- Conducted the monthly fire drill and AED check.
- Gave a Yello Dyno presentation at the monthly parent meeting.
