Education / Disabilities / ERSE

- Continued to enroll students for all programs.
- Sixteen students on the HS waiting list are being served in PK 4 classrooms. Five have turned down an available 1/2 day PK slot and 2 are pending additional information.
- Teachers completed ongoing assessment information in Galileo. A January meeting is scheduled to analyze first semester information in order to make curriculum decisions.
- Working toward utilizing AWARE for all SATs.
- Required reports were submitted to OHS.

Family Involvement & Community Partnerships / Attendance / Transition / Volunteers

- The December Parent Meeting was held on the 2rd with 17% of the ECC parents attending. The topic was child development. The information shared was reinforced through a favorite activity of parents, Bingo for Books.
- Parents were encouraged to register for spring GED and ESL classes early.
- Twenty-three ECC families are known to have had some level of CPS involvement this year.
- Volunteers attended and assisted with many classroom activities during December. One important event was Polar Express Day with 10 families participating.

Health / Mental Health / Campus Safety / Nutrition

- Provided first aid to 38 students.
- Followed-up on required immunizations & HS physical & dental exams through phone calls, letters, and teacher conferences.
- Sent immunization notices and updated Skyward.
- Scheduled and conducted 3 nutrition appointments in conjunction with nutrition consultant, Laverne Boles, for parents of obese students.
- Met with Bree Hendrix-Peart, mental health consultant, to discuss any concerns.
- Completed the second Yello Dyno lesson in HS and PK 4 classes.
- Conducted the monthly fire drill and AED check.
