

2009-2014 District Committees

“Academic Excellence Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Academic Excellence Committee” will research “best practices” of honors and Gifted and Talented (G/T) programs in the state.

“Budget Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Budget Committee” will serve as a regular standing committee providing campus, parental, and community input throughout the development of the KISD annual budget. The “Budget Committee” is comprised of parent/citizen members, board members, administrators, and instructional staff.

“Faculty Community Advisory Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Faculty Community Advisory Committee (FCAC)” will serve as a regular standing committee. In compliance with Education Code 11.251, the FCAC shall review educational goals, objectives, and major district-wide classroom instructional programs identified by the Board or school superintendent. The FCAC shall also recommend the district calendar, discuss campus concerns, and approve district-wide staff development programs.

“Outsourcing Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Outsourcing Committee” will research specific department service areas that may be privatized or contracted through local area, regional, or state cooperatives and entities.

“PTO President’s Advisory Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “PTO President’s Advisory Committee” will be a regular standing committee that will meet four times per year to facilitate open dialogue and enhanced communication between the superintendent and the campus PTO presidents. The agenda for each meeting will be superintendent initiated and shall be based on committee requests and district-wide concerns.

“Safe and Drug Free Schools Community Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Safe and Drug Free Community Committee” meets four times a year to review, evaluate, and recommend effective drug and violence prevention programs based on identified school community risk and protective factors.

“Safety Advisory Health Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Safety Advisory Health Committee” meets four times a year to make recommendations on district wellness policy, human sexuality curriculum, and the amount of time and appropriate materials for instruction and other health and wellness issues.

“Technology Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Technology Committee” will meet four times per year to review various topics related to the District Technology Plan.

“Title III Limited English Proficient (LEP) Team”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Title III Limited English Proficient (LEP) Team” meets two times a year to review and evaluate LEP student academic performance in relation to regular student performance as well as create and monitor an effective continuous improvement plan. The committee will also recommend scientifically based programs to decrease the academic achievement gap between LEP students and other students, as well as target weaknesses for intervention.

“District Long-Range Facilities Planning Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School “District Long-Range Facilities Planning Committee” will create a comprehensive master plan that evaluates existing district facilities for future use.

“Elementary School Rezoning Committee”

Charge: The “Elementary School Rezoning Committee” will convene to study residential development and student enrollment trends and will make recommendations to the Board of Trustees for elementary school attendance boundary adjustments.

“Curriculum Writing Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Curriculum Writing Committee” will analyze student assessment data and continue researching “best practices” in the four core subject areas in order to update and strengthen the district’s one-line curriculum.

“Curriculum Advisory Council”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Curriculum Advisory Council” will serve in an advisory role to the Deputy Superintendent of Curriculum regarding district-wide curriculum and student assessment policies and procedures.

“Policy Committee”

Charge: The Kerrville Independent School District “Policy Committee” will serve as a committee that will meet as needed to review specific policies for recommendation to the Board of Trustees.
